U.S. News and World Report, the global authority in health care rankings, once again identified **Stoddard Baptist Nursing Home** as one of the **Best Nursing Homes for 2018-19**. The U.S. News evaluated more than 15,000 homes nationwide, in every state and nearly 100 major metropolitan areas and this year identified 2,975 nursing homes to earn the designation of a U.S. News Best Nursing Home.

For the 2018-19 ratings, U.S. News has updated the methodology used to evaluate nursing homes to ensure that the designation of Best Nursing Home is given only to those homes that demonstrate appropriate use of key services and consistent performance in quality measures. Nursing homes needed to receive an overall score from CMS in July 2018 and a staffing rating in either April or July to be eligible for a U.S. News overall rating. Only nursing homes that rated high, performing in either the overall or short-stay rehabilitation rating AND average or higher in the other rating received a Best Nursing Home designation.

Ms. Helen Hurd was born on February 21, 1922 in Montgomery, Alabama. She lived through the years of Jim Crow, where blacks were separated from restaurants, bathrooms, theaters, water fountains just to name a few. She saw the Black awakening in the 1960s and lived to witness the first Black to serve as president of the United States.

Ms. Hurd has been a resident of the Marigold since 2014 and is the third resident to move into the facility. She is the proud mother of five children, 2 deceased and the grandmother of 15 grandchildren and many great-grandchildren. She is especially proud of her grandson, the renowned feather weight boxer, Jarret Hurd of Accokeek, Maryland. Ms. Hurd, at the tender age of 96, is independent in performing ADLs (Activities of Daily Living). Before retiring, she enjoyed traveling with her family. She currently goes shopping with her devoted daughter, Catherine. Ms. Hurd is known to the Marigold family as the best dancer, as she actively participates in events and wows other residents and staff with her dance moves. Ms. Hurd's goal is to continue to be independent and live to be 100 years old.
