



On Friday, June 12th, D.C. resident, Corey Cappelloni, ran 220 miles from D.C. to Scranton, Pennsylvania to see his 98 year-old grandmother from outside her window at the Allied Services Skilled Nursing and Rehabilitation Center. His goal is to raise awareness for the needs of all older adults and the heroic staff that care for them, as he stated:

"This endurance challenge is a way for me to show Nana that I am there for her, to raise awareness for all the residents in nursing homes, assisted living facilities and rehabilitation centers across the country and the world. The run is also to honor the victims of coronavirus, including my great uncle Charles "Chuck" Gloman who passed away on May 11th, and to deeply thank all the heroic staff at Allied Services and similar organizations for putting the care of others first."

On the first stage of his journey, Corey ran down Wisconsin Avenue and through Georgetown before making his way around the Mall and circling back through Dupont Circle and Adams Morgan. On his way out of the District, he ran past Stoddard Baptist Nursing Home in Northwest, where staff and residents were awaiting his arrival to offer socially distanced support.

A Hearty Thank You to Our Donors



Howard University Faculty Practice Plan Opens a Second COVID-19 Testing Facility at Pennsylvania Avenue Baptist Church in Ward 7



The **Howard University Faculty Practice Plan** has opened a second COVID-19 Testing Facility at **The Pennsylvania Avenue Baptist Church**, 3000 Pennsylvania Avenue, Southeast, Washington, D.C., to provide expanded access to free testing to residents in Ward 7 and 8, where testing is needed the most. The testing site is open on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10:00 a. m. to 2:00 p.m., by appointment. A Howard medical team member will see patients who are showing symptoms or who believe they are asymptomatic. For appointments, please call the Faculty Practice Plan at 202-865-2109.

"Given the essential role testing plays in protecting our community from COVID, I am pleased that Howard University has chosen Pennsylvania Avenue Baptist Church as a testing site," said Rev. Kendrick Curry, Pastor of Pennsylvania Avenue Baptist Church. "This partnership will go a long way in protecting the health of my community. It has been one of my dreams to have COVID testing."

While the testing sites are short term assignments that will be managed during the pandemic, the Virtual Health Ministry project is positioned to begin a long-term investment into the community. Faith institution-managed call centers, staffed by health ministry leaders from the participant faith institutions, will make proactive calls to residents to determine health and social needs and to provide public health information to mitigate the spread of the virus. The faith based coordinators serve as a bridge to connect those who need it to healthcare providers using telemedicine; or to the Howard University School of Social Work where navigators connect people with social and counseling resources.


Employee Memorials






